








► Grafico 1: Matriz de relaciones entre los 6 ODS y las 42 metas








The OECD Localised SDGs Indicator Framework

Which regions and cities are we covering?


- **Regions:** first administrative tier of subnational government or TL2 Large Regions.
- **Coverage:** 600+ TL2 Large Regions of 48 countries (36 OECD + 12 partners):
 - 400 TL2 Large Regions of OECD
 - + TL2 Large Regions of 5 LAC countries (Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica and Peru), 5 EU28 countries, Tunisia and Russia
- **Cities:** Metropolitan areas or Functional Urban Areas of more than 250K people.
- **Coverage:** 600+ FUAs of 33 OECD countries + Colombia
 - 628 OECD FUAs
 - + FUAs of Colombia

How to define “relevant” SDGs for cities & regions in OECD countries?





120+ indicators to measure 61/103 targets identified as “very relevant” for regions and cities in OECD


Distance of OECD Regions to the end values for 2030, by Goal


