

Stockholm at a Glance

- 9.5 million in Sweden
- 2,1 million in Stockholm region
- 880 000 in City of Stockholm
- Area: 209 km2
- 50% of the land area are parks and green areas
- Strong innovation capacity and specialisation in high-tech sector thanks to a skilled labour force, especially in science and technology
- Stockholm is the most knowledgeintensive region outside the U.S. (WKCI)


World Class Fiber network

THE E-SERVICE PROGRAM

Decision taken by the City council > 650 million SEK (approximately € 72 000 000)

Goals:

- To provide better services for the citizens of Stockholm, companies and vistitors
- To work smarter ensuring that all kinds of matters are dealt with more quickly.
- To work more efficiently in order to free up resources.
- To gain transparency and a better overview of what is happening in the city.





Ageing and IT services in Stockholm

- All housing for the elderly are connected through the City IT services
- 54 percent of the Swedish people aged 66 plus used internet.
- Ipads are getting more and more used among elderly people.
- Most common use:
 - Surfing
 - Looking for news
 - Look for timetables
 - Log in to internet bank office
 - Look for and buy travels



40 lpad cafés for elderly in Stockholm

- Many elderly have found the lpad – a user friendly computer
- By experience we know that the use of social media such as Facebook is increasing among elderly
- Many meeting points arrange well-attended Ipad cafés where elderly can get help for using the device.





Congestion tax

- Implemented 2007
- •20 % decrease in traffic 1-2 €
- •10 14 % decrease of emissions
- •2 10 % better air quality
- •Investment cost, € 200 million
- Annual revenue, € 80 million
- Annual running costs, € 15 million
- Annual net, € 65 million to new infrastructure
