【Main Points of Session II】

- ◆ Recognizing that relying solely on government agencies to realize and implement local government SDGs is not enough; **stakeholders in the government, private sector and academia** must form strong partnerships at the local level.
- ◆ Calling for the creation of **organizations and mechanisms** to facilitate the formation of these partnerships.
- ◆ Introducing and discussing **private sector and NGO case studies and initiatives** among those implemented in Japan and overseas, including the FutureCity Initiative, disaster recovery, and revitalizing slum areas, etc.
- ◆ Discussing **the way forward for local community and issue-specific partnerships** in realizing and implementing local government SDGs, and gaining a deeper knowledge of the **organizations and mechanisms** required for building powerful partnerships.

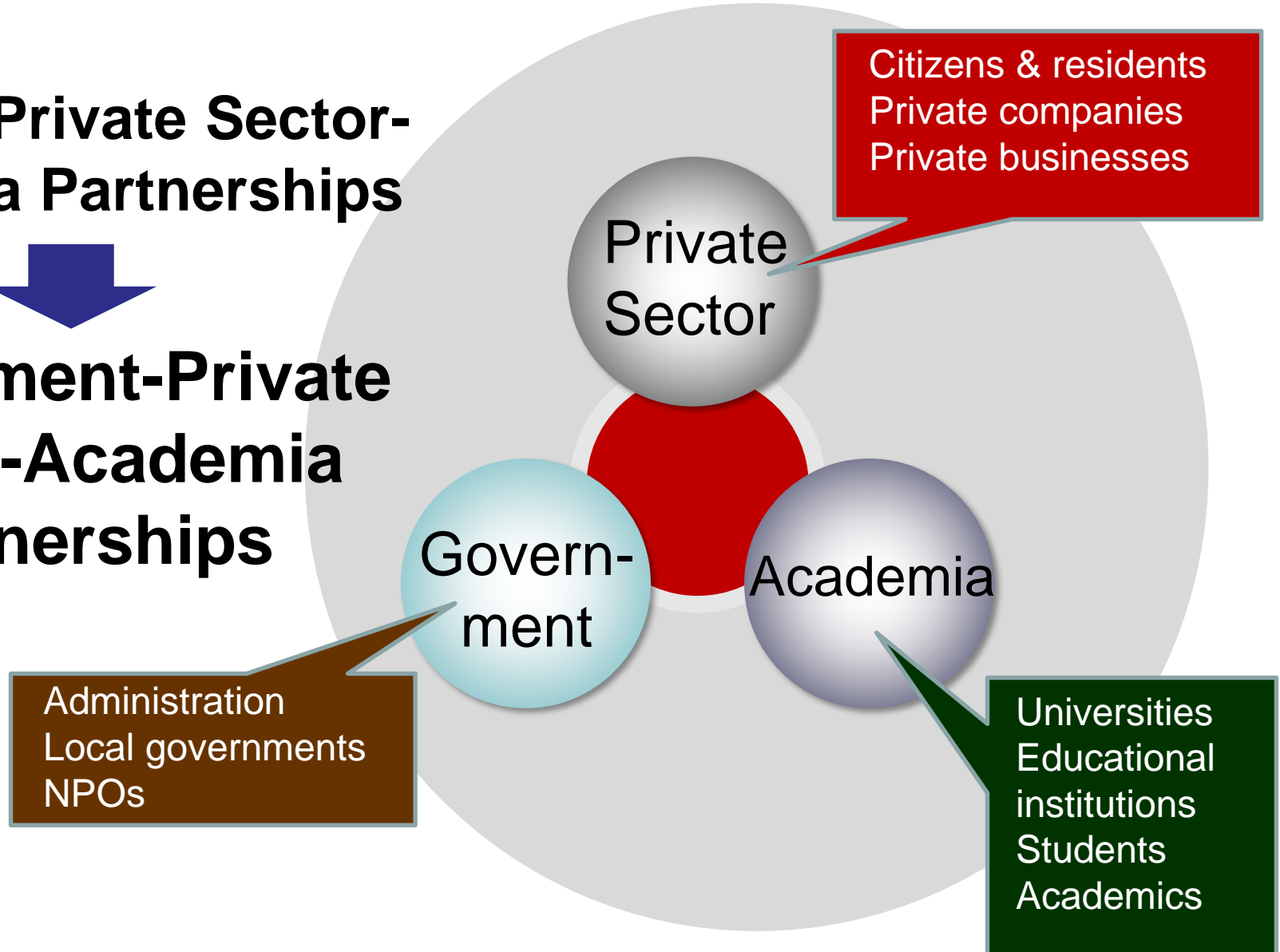
