Mitigating measures to cope with Covid-19 pandemic :

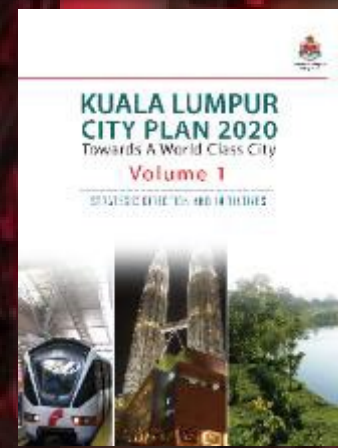
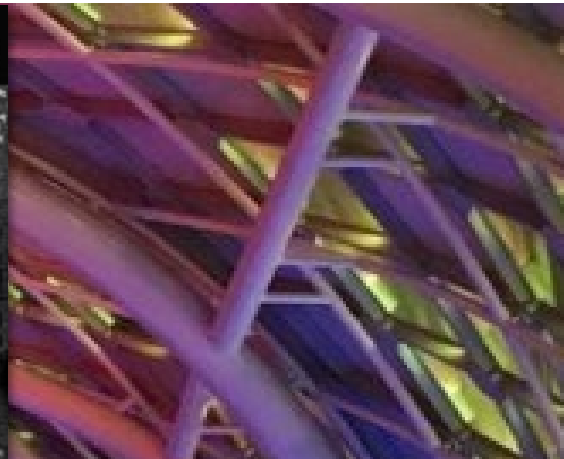
- Social distancing**

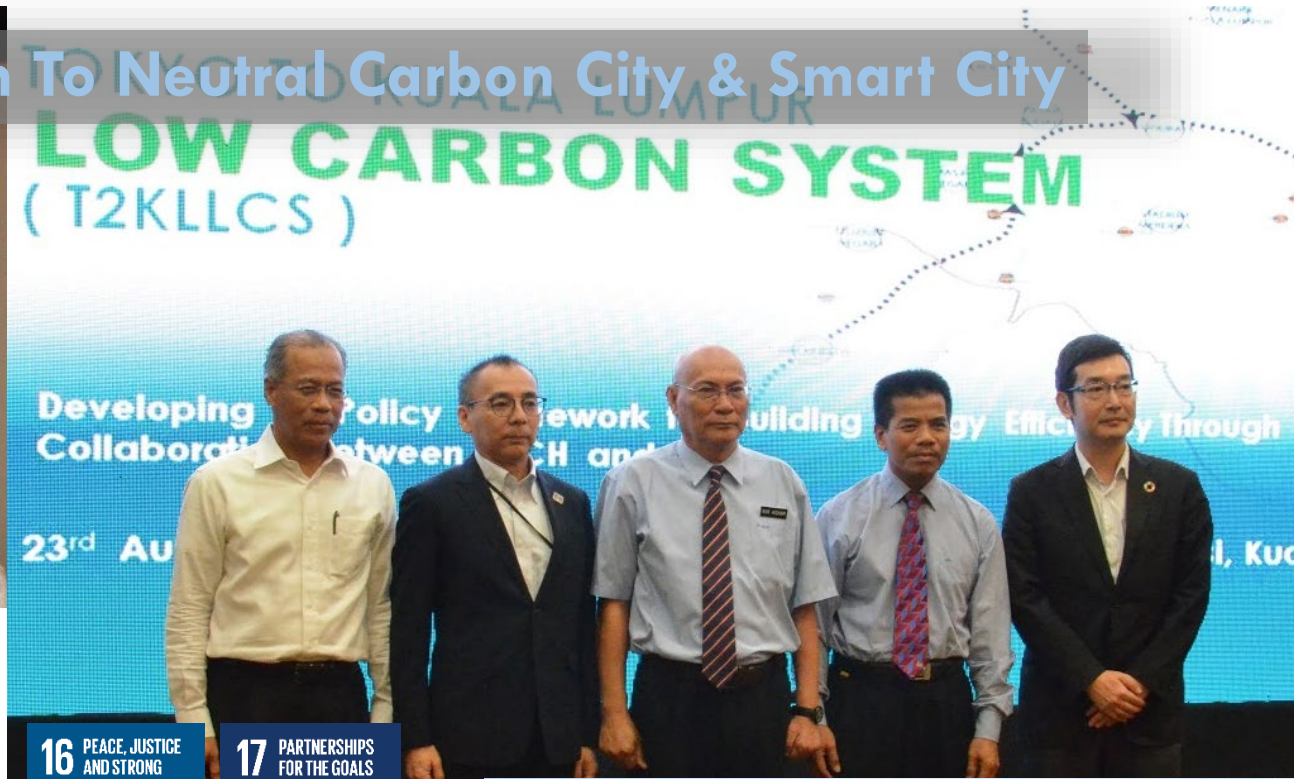
